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REGISTRATIONS

Alarm Systems

The Barrington **Police Department** requires that all alarm systems, business and residential, be registered, which enables the department to quickly locate the premises. Please use the appropriate form below to register your alarm system.

Dog Licensing

Licensing Period

The Town of Barrington requires all residents to register dogs, over four months old, with the town clerk. The license period runs from May 1st through April 30th of each year; license renewals are generally accepted after January 1st of each year.

You can also arrange to renew the license by mail.

Requirements

State law requires that, before a license is issued, the owner or keeper of a dog must furnish proof that the dog has been vaccinated against rabies. The annual license fee is less for a dog that has been spayed or neutered; evidence of the procedure must be given to the clerk. Feel free to contact the **Town Clerk's Office** to determine if this information is already on file for your dog.

Penalties

Failure to license your dog is a violation of state law and city/town ordinances. In addition to the annual license fee, you will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per month for each month (or part of a month) after June 1st. After receiving notice of civil forfeiture, you will have 15 days to license your pet; otherwise, the case will given to the police department and the owner will be levied a civil forfeiture fee of \$25.00 AND a \$5.00 service fee [\$30.00 TOTAL].

Hand Guns

The Barrington **Police Department** requires that all residents register their hand guns. Completed state applications (link below) can be dropped off at the Police Station during business hours.

Note that hand gun licenses are only issued to non-residents by the New Hampshire State Police. For more information, go to the State Police **Pistol and Revolver Licensing** web page.

Motor Vehicles

The Town Clerk is an authorized municipal and on-line agent for The Department of Motor Vehicles, and can complete registrations for any passenger vehicle, trailer, or motorcycle with a gross vehicle weight up to 26,000 lbs.

The office can now check the availability of vanity plates and place orders, as well as, issue conservation plates.

In an effort to expedite the vehicle registration process and eliminate the need to wait in line, we will be expanding our mail-in program by year's end. Please contact our office at 664-5476 for information. Watch for future updates as we expand this program in our ongoing effort to meet your needs.

The Town Clerk's Office cannot complete the following plate types, which must be completed at a Motor Vehicle Sub-Station or in Concord:

- Transfers on 3-4 digit plates, lease to owner, owner to lease, leased vehicles with a change to a different leasing company
- Construction equipment (new) (renewals can be completed if under 26,000 lbs.
- Boats (new or renewal)
- First time registration for:
 - Antique (Concord Only)
 - Apportioned (Concord Only)
 - Veteran
 - Handicap
 - Street Rod
 - Commercial

Documentation Required

- **Renewals** - Residents must have their current registration or a photocopy.
- **Transfers** - Residents must have their current registration. We can not accept photocopies for transfers.
- **New** - For Vehicles 1996 or newer, the resident must have the title or title application papers.
- **Older** - For vehicles 1995 or older, the resident must have a **bill of sale and one of the following**:
 - The previous owners New Hampshire registration or a photocopy
 - A New Hampshire or out-of-state title or a photocopy
 - Form TDMV 19A, which must be filled out by a New Hampshire Law Enforcement Officer or an authorized New Hampshire Inspection Station.

Voting

Voter registration is handled by the **Town Clerk's Office**.

You must bring a form of proof of residency:

- Rent receipt
- Utility bill
- Mortgage statement
- NH driver's license).

Voter registration services are also provided at the polls during the day of any election.
